

Staying Safe Online

- 1) Don't post any personal information online like your address, email address or mobile number.
- 2) Think carefully before posting pictures or videos of yourself. Once you've put a picture of yourself online most people can see it and may be able to download it, it's not just yours anymore.
- 3) Keep your privacy settings as high as possible
- 4) Never give out your passwords
- 5) Don't befriend people you don't know & don't meet up with people you've met online. Speak to your parent or carer about people suggesting you do
- 7) Remember that not everyone online is who they say they are
- 8) Think carefully about what you say before you post something online.
- 9) Respect other people's views, even if you don't agree with someone else's views doesn't mean you need to be rude
- 10) If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried: leave the website, turn off your computer if you want to and tell a trusted adult immediately.



This week we have had some of the older children bringing issues from playing out after school or at the weekend into school. This has caused upset for some

frustration for others. The children have been reminded that what happens after school should not be brought into school and that each day in school is a <u>fresh start</u>... We have also spoken to the older children and explained if something happens outside of school that the people they should talk to initially are their parents, as parents can often put things into perspective a little more.
